- NSTec will develop a proposal with cost and schedule for the repackaging and segregation of the waste in the 58 oversized boxes and two spheres. The proposal must be accepted by the Nevada Site Office before the planned activities for the TRU Project can be described.
- Upon approval of the Waste Stream Profile Form, the VERB glovebox will be disposed as LLW at the NTS

It was particularly helpful to receive detailed comments from each of the reviewers to ensure that we fully understand individual perspectives and insights into the complexities of the UGTA project.

Although the CAB employed a different approach to the well siting challenge, the comments were professional, thorough, and respectful of our approach. The real value of receiving and considering different perspectives is the opportunity it provides to broaden discussions and, in turn, more thoroughly consider an array of alternatives that may exist to address this highly complex natural groundwater system.

As a citizen advisory board, our primary concerns are the protection of human health and the environment, including public water supplies. From the support we have been provided by DOE's environmental management team, it is obvious that this is your major focus as well.

Please extend our appreciation to Bill Wilborn and the TWG for their assistance. Their feedback will aid us in future recommendations. We look forward to further collaboration as we move closer to plan UGTA well siting and drilling efforts in fiscal year 2009.
